a difference...

Travelling south on the highway, a truck travelling at 100 km/hour overtakes you. Suddenly, a rear wheel comes off. You are **now** confronted with a runaway wheel travelling at 190 km/hour heading towards **your** windscreen ...

What would **you** think of? – Why **me**? Why **us**? Why **now**? Just two seconds earlier or later, and it would have been all different. **NO** prior warning was given to you.

Most people are **not** ready to meet their *Maker*. How about **you**? Would you have been prepared? Are you prepared?

How do you prepare?

Firstly, you must accept you are a sinner.

Romans 3:23 – “For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;”

No one is perfect. No one - you and I - has lived up to God's perfect standard.

Secondly, you must accept that a price must be paid for your sin.

Romans 5:12 – “Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned:”

As sinners, if we should pay what we owe, then we must spend eternity in the lake of fire (Hell) to pay the debt of sin.

Thirdly, you must accept that Jesus Christ has already paid your sin debt.

Romans 5:6 – “For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly.”

John 3:16 – “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.”

2 Corinthians 5:21 – “For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.”

These scriptures declare clearly that Jesus Christ has already paid your sin debt on your behalf.

Fourthly, you must accept by faith what Jesus Christ did for you.

John 3:36 – “He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life; and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.”

Ninety times in the gospel of John, the Bible instructs its readers to “believe”; which means to trust, to depend, to rely on. So, to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ means that you accept the fact you are a sinner, that as a sinner you owe the sin penalty, that Jesus Christ instead died on the cross for you to pay the debt you owe, and that you completely trust Jesus to get you to Heaven.

This means that you decide to put the matter of your salvation into His hands, and depend on Him to get to Heaven, where you will spend everlasting life.

John 5:24 – “Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life.”
